Guys like Torin Westbrook aren't supposed to exist in real life.



She attended the University of Idaho for three years before transferring to the University of California in 1917, where she graduated Phi Beta Kappa in 1918, the same year she married. *Anything Can Happen on the River*, Brink's first novel, was published in 1934. She was awarded an honorary doctorate of letters from the University of Idaho in 1965. Brink Hall, which houses the UI English Department and faculty offices, is named in her honor. The children's section of the Moscow, Idaho, Carnegie public library is also named after her.

With standout illustrations that are both charming and intricate, children and parents alike will want to pore over this story again and again.

LISA FALKENSTERN created steampunk gadgets in her studio in New Jersey as she worked on this book. Altogether, she made numerous sculptures and used 1,072 pieces of hardware before she started the artwork.
