We Were Liars meets The Raven Boys in this steamy, mind-bending tale of revenge, sinister privilege, and forbidden desires set at an elite boarding school.

Seventeen-year-old Marin James has spent her entire life living in the shadow of the exclusive Huntsworth Academy. So when her cousin's dead body is found in a creek on school property, Marin knows exactly who's to blame: Adrian Graves and Henry Wu, the enigmatic, yet dangerous leaders of the school's ecosystem.

Swapping her ragged T-shirts for a crisp prep school uniform, Marin infiltrates Huntsworth to exact her revenge. But her quest for vengeance is quickly muddied by a confusing attraction to her new life, and to the two dysfunctional and devastating boys who understand her better than anyone ever has.

When Marin uncovers a dark, eerie secret hiding behind Huntsworth's ivied gates, the lines between justice and vengeance, love and hate, and the real and supernatural begin to crumble—and nothing is as it seems.



# WHAT WAKES THE BELLS by Elle Tesch

In this gothic YA fantasy debut, when an ancient evil is awakened, a bell keeper must decide how far she's willing to go to save her sentient city—and which of her loved ones she's willing to kill to do it.

Built by long-gone Saints, the city of Vaiwyn lives and breathes and bleeds. As a Keeper, Mina knows better than most what her care of Vaiwyn's bells means for the sentient city. It's the Strauss family's thousand-year legacy—prevent the Vespers from ringing, or they will awake a slumbering evil.

One afternoon, Mina's clock strikes one, but to her horror, her bell peals thirteen times, shattering the city's tenuous peace. With so much of the city's history and lore lost in a long-ago disaster, no one knows the danger that has been unleashed—until the city begins to fight back. As the sun sets, stone gargoyles and bronze statues tear away from their buildings and plinths to hunt people though the streets. Trapped in Mina's bell, the soul of a twisted and power-hungry Saint festered. Now free of his prison, he hides behind the face of one of Vaiwyn's citizens, corrupting the city and turning it on itself.

Time is running out, and the only chance Mina has to stop the destruction and horrific killings is finding and destroying the Saint's host. Everyone is a suspect, including Mina's closest loved ones. She will have to decide how far she'll go to save her city—and who she's willing to kill to do it.

High school has just ended and Eddie is at a loss for what's next. He never really related to the rest of his peers in the sleepy Colorado suburb he calls home. The future holds no promise for him currently, so he finds solace in his imagination.

Until his eccentric great-aunt Cookie asks him to come to New York to take care of her in her old age. Eddie leaps at the opportunity, and when he arrives in the city his life begins to find some direction. Especially after Cookie asks Eddie to take a vintage Polaroid camera to snap pictures of her favorite places since she can't leave the house, and the camera begins to launch Eddie back in time to an entirely different New York of the early 20th century.

As Eddie explores the underground queer life of the 1920s, he begins to get in touch with the undercurrents of his own identity. Not to mention there's a handsome boy who keeps popping up in his visions of the past. But when Eddie begins to develop a crush on the mercurial Francis, a cute baker named Theo enters the picture—and he's in the present. Caught between timelines and feelings, Eddie must make a decision about what he's willing to chase: his fantasies or a reality that might just be what he's wanted all along.


From author Elisa A. Bonnin comes Lovely Dark and Deep, a YA dark academia novel exploring magic, loneliness, and the power of found family.

# A BÁNH MÌ FOR TWO by Trinity Nguyen



In Sài Gòn, Chinese-Vietnamese Lan tries to be the perfect daughter: dependable and willing to care for her widowed mother and their banh mì stall. Her secret passion, however, is A Bánh Mì for Two, the food blog she started with her father, but has stopped updating since his passing.

Meanwhile, Vietnamese-American Vivi Huynh, has never been to Việt Nam. Her parents rarely even talk of the homeland that clearly haunts them. Vivi can only daydream about Sài Gòn through the eyes of A Bánh Mì for Two: her favorite food account dedicated to street food of the city. # **BIOLOGY LESSONS** by Melissa Kantor



The risks to people she loves and those who have befriended her terrify Grace, but with Addie and Sebastian by her side, at least she isn't alone.

This inspiring true story of grit, tenacity, and hope traces Elvira's path as she overcomes impossible hurdles in her race to freedom.





# **HIDDEN TAILS** by Van Hoang







And still a kid.

But when all of this does, indeed, happen, Kwame must find a way to save the world and somehow, face his feelings about his grandmother's passing head-on.

Adventurous, memorable, and hilarious, Craig Kofi Farmer's middle grade fantasy is an immersive and powerful debut that tackles themes of identity, intergenerational connectedness, and how to say goodbye with heart, humor, and an epic dose of magic.


### WHALES IN THE CITY by Nancy F. Castaldo; illustrated by Chuck Groenink
