





Despite their love for each other, Mi-ja and Young-sook's differences are impossible to ignore. The Island of Sea Women is an epoch set over many decades, beginning during a period of Japanese colonialism in the 1930s through the era of cell phones and wet suits for the women divers. Mi-ja is the daughter of a Japanese collaborator, and she will forever be marked by

this association. Young-sook was born into a long line of haenyeo and will inherit her mother's position leading the divers in their village.

Their friendship is tested by war, betrayal, and the rough depths of the ocean. This beautiful, ambitious novel illuminates a world turned upside down and, ultimately, the power of forgiveness.

But while the *Athenia* is still steaming across the Atlantic, war in Europe unexpectedly breaks out, tasking Seth with saving the movie star in the middle of an open ocean swarming with Nazis. Their escape brings Garbo's film career to a premature end and shatters both their lives. And, unbeknownst to James, hearing their story decades later will change his own life forever.

In October 1771, a merchant ship out of Amsterdam, *Vrouw Maria*, was delivering a dozen Dutch masterpiece paintings to Russian Empress Catherine the Great, when it crashed on storm-drenched boulders off the Finnish coast, taking her priceless cargo to the depths of the Baltic Sea. Among the lost treasures mourned was *The Nursery*, an oak-paneled triptych by Leiden fine painter Gerrit Dou,

Rembrandt's first student and Holland's first international superstar artist. The *Vrouw Maria* became a Baltic legend, confounding would-be salvagers for more than two hundred years. In July 1999, a daring Finnish wreck hunter found *Vrouw Maria*, upright on the sea floor and perfectly preserved. In a narrative non-fiction rendering, in the spirit of Gary Kinder and Robert Kurson, *Art Wreck* is a tale of maritime adventure and archaeology that plays out on the beguiling Archipelago Sea.
