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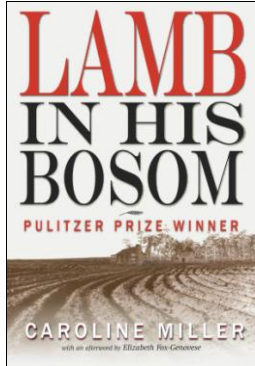

LAMB IN HIS BOSOM, by Caroline Miller 09/11



This Pulitzer Prize-winning classic (1934) reveals the flip side of *Gone With the Wind*—the story of the poor settlers of the Georgia backwoods—people who never owned a slave or planned to fight a war. Set in the Georgia backwoods about 20 years before the Civil War, the story begins at the start of Cean and Lonzo Smith's marriage. The story revolves around the life and thoughts of Cean, and how she manages as a young wife and mother. Her life is marked by hard work, love for her husband, and birthing, raising, and burying her babies. Often called "The Poor Man's *Gone with the Wind*," *Lamb In His Bosom* is more reminiscent of *Cold Mountain* as it does not romanticize the South or the Civil War.

CAROLINE MILLER was born in 1904. In 1934, she won the Pulitzer Prize for Literature. Her second novel, *Lebanon*, was published in 1944.

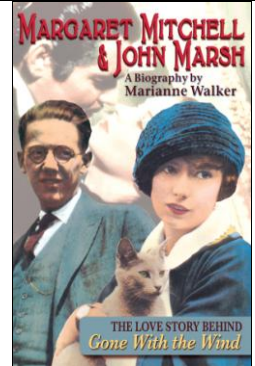

MARGARET MITCHELL AND JOHN MARSH: The Love Story Behind *Gone With the Wind*, by Marianne Walker 09/11



Based on almost 200 previously unpublished letters and extensive interviews with their closest associates, Walker's biography offers a new look into a devoted marriage and fascinating partnership that ultimately created a Pulitzer Prize-winning novel. Re-released in time for the 75th anniversary of the publication of *Gone With the Wind*.

In lively extracts from their letters to family and friends, John and "Peggy" describe the stormy years of their courtship, their bohemian lifestyle as a young married couple, the arduous but fulfilling years when Peggy was writing her famous novel, the thrill of its acceptance for publication and its literary success, and the excitement of the making of the movie. In telling the private side of this twenty-four-year marriage, Walker details their intimate and moving love story.

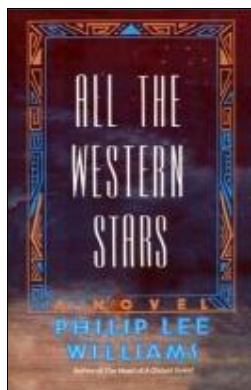

ALL THE WESTERN STARS, by Philip Lee Williams

Jake Baker, a seventy-three-year-old former construction worker who walked the high steel, suddenly finds himself ill and relegated to an old folks' home by his insensitive niece. There he regains his health and meets Lucas Kraft, the shell of a famous novelist and a former National Book Award winner, who is searching for the remnants of his talents and his life. These two men from vastly different backgrounds share a common bond – they're both on the run. Running from their pasts, from their mortality, from the fear of dying unfulfilled.

Overcoming initial antipathy, the two unite to escape from the home, sharing a dream of ending their days as cowboys in Texas. After hitchhiking from Georgia they find work on a ranch near Abilene, Jake in the kitchen and Lucas back at the typewriter. Both land parts as extras in a movie being filmed nearby, which stars Lucas's former wife. As Lucas hatches a plot to effect a marital reunion, Jake has romantic longings for a woman who works on the ranch, both men finding the path to love as compelling and adventurous as any wild-West fantasy they'd imagined. In the end each claims far more than his cowboy dream, discovering friendship and love as well as vigor and true heroism.

PHILIP LEE WILLIAMS is the author of 14 books, including ten novels and two works of nonfiction. Williams' works have been translated into Swedish, German, French, and Japanese.

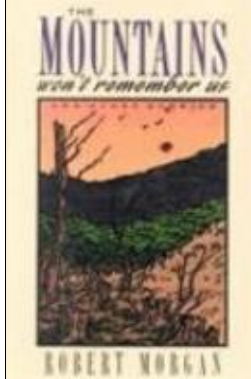

THE MOUNTAINS WON'T REMEMBER US, by Robert Morgan

In this collection of short stories, celebrated author and poet Robert Morgan portrays the lives and history of a strong-limbed, strong-willed people: the settlers of the Blue Ridge Mountains and their descendants.

Struggling to survive in an ancient mountain landscape that alternately thwarts their efforts and infuses them with joy and vitality, Morgan's people undergo the transition from the Indian skirmishes of the post-Revolutionary War era to the trailer parks of the present day. With one eye on the land itself and the other on its inhabitants, Morgan poignantly portrays a history of change, of transformation in the landscape, in humanity's relationship to the earth, and in people's relationships with each other.

ROBERT MORGAN is a professor of English at Cornell University and the author of several novels, and volumes of poetry, and collections of short stories. His novel, *GAP CREEK*, was an Oprah's Book Club selection. His latest novel, *LIONS OF THE WEST*, was recently published to great acclaim.

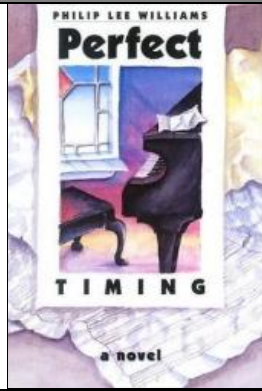

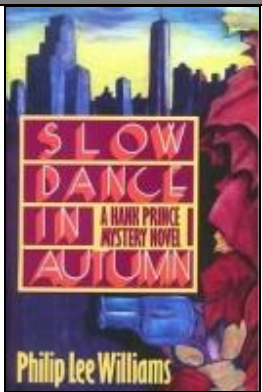

PERFECT TIMING, by Philip Lee Williams

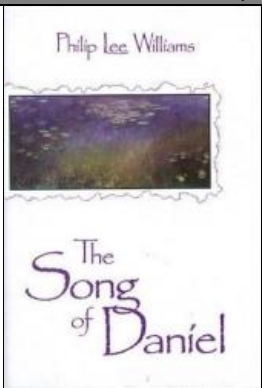
Perfect Timing explores the mind of a man on a riotous adventure through heaven, hell, and Myrtle Beach. Ford Clayton is a music professor at a small conservatory in Asheville, North Carolina, facing a thinning hairline, a crumbling marriage, and the failure of his dreams of symphonic genius. Worn out from wrestling with the triple burden of marriage, music, and maturity, and in need of some resolution in his life, he is startled to recognize his first love, a formerly gifted pianist, in a television documentary on the homeless. Accompanied by his recently paroled, born-again, hilariously insane cousin, Ford sets out on a mission to rescue Camille Malone from the ranks of the homeless, to confront his past and define his future, and to finally finish something he's started.

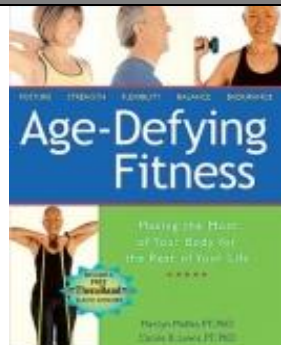
SONG OF DANIEL, by Philip Lee Williams

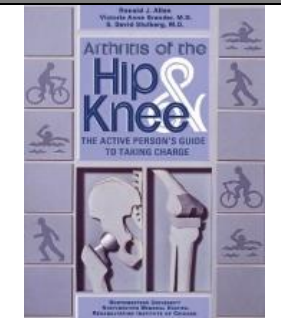

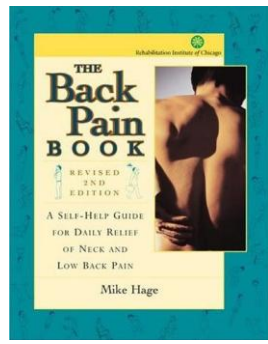

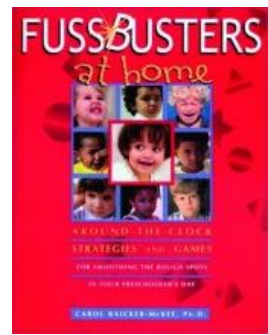

FUSSBUSTERS AT HOME, by Carol Baicker-McKee, PhD

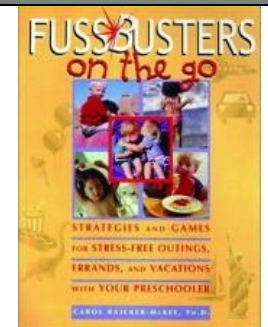

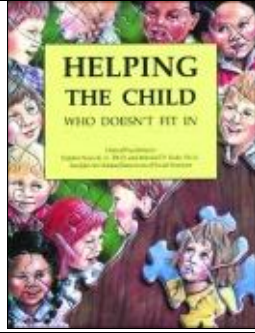

HELPING THE CHILD WHO DOESN'T FIT IN, by Stephen Nowicki and Marshall Duke

Remember the kids who just didn't fit in? Maybe they stood too close, or talked too loud. Whatever the reason, we called them hurtful names, and they never understood why. Now, clinical psychologists Duke and Nowicki call these children "dyssemic," and offer some ideas of how to help them. Dyssemic children cannot readily comprehend nonverbal messages, much as dyslexics do not correctly process the written word. Yet nonverbal communication plays a vital role in our communication with others, and children who misunderstand or misuse it may face painful social rejection. Duke and Nowicki show parents and teachers how to assess the extent of a child's problem, as well as how to help the dyssemic child.

STEPHEN NOWICKI JR., PhD, is the author of over 150 publications and presentations and the coauthor of several books. He received his PhD from Purdue University.

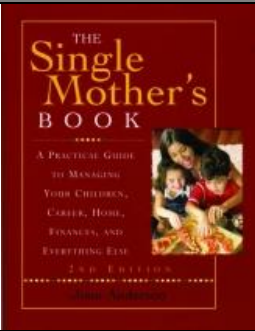

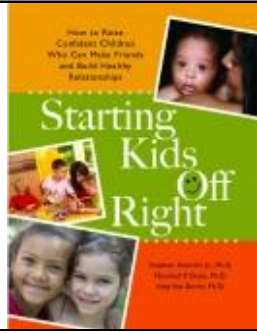

STARTING KIDS OFF RIGHT, by Stephen Nowicki, Marshall Duke, and Amy Van Buren



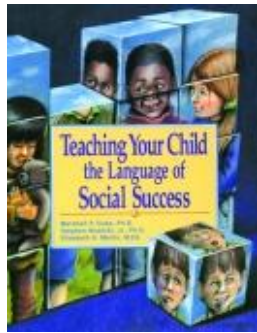
Clinical Psychologists Stephen Nowicki, Marshall Duke, and Amy Van Buren offer parents, teachers, and caregivers insights gathered from decades of professional experience into the hows and whys of relationship building from infancy up to the age of twelve. Written in easy-to-understand, jargon-free language, the book begins with overviews of social development, human relationship theory, and the role of nonverbal language in forming relationships. The book is then broken down into chapters by developmental stages: infancy (birth to two years), childhood (two to five years), and juvenile era (five to ten years).

TEACHING YOUR CHILD THE LANGUAGE OF SOCIAL SUCCESS, by Marshall Duke, Stephen Nowicki, and Elisabeth Martin



Help your child master the language of nonverbal communication.
 Scientific studies show that up to 90% of any message is communicated nonverbally, and that nonverbal skills relate directly to academic achievement and social success. Only 10% of the population is truly deficient in these skills; 80% of us have room for improvement. Fortunately, nonverbal communication can be both taught and learned, just like any other language. Clinical psychologists Nowicki and Duke have devoted their careers to this groundbreaking research. Now they have joined with educator Elisabeth Martin to create a valuable book which shows parents and teachers how to improve children's nonverbal communication skills, offering the tools children need to communicate ideas and establish and maintain relationships. Using case studies, exercises, and illustrations, the authors outline the six channels of nonverbal communication and show adults how to access a child's strengths and weaknesses.
